INTRODUCTION

The *Drinking Water Protection Act* requires a water supplier to monitor and protect its drinking water. Water Suppliers are required to submit an Emergency Response and Contingency Plan (ERCP). An ERCP is a written document that spells out a water system's plan of action for responding to potential emergencies, disasters or abnormal operational circumstances.

Purpose

The purpose of the Cowichan Bay Water Improvement District Emergency Response Plan is to outline the variety of emergencies that the District could face and proposes a framework to plan for emergencies, minimize disruption of customer service in order to protect public health and safety.

Background

Cowichan Bay Waterworks District is an Improvement District charged with the safe supply of domestic water.

Cowichan Bay Waterworks District Emergency Response Process

1. SYSTEM OVERVIEW

Cowichan Bay Waterworks District groundwater comes from two wells, supplied by the Valleyview Wells located off Cowichan Bay Road. This site draws from a deep aquifer of high-quality groundwater. All sites are equipped with chlorination pumps with liquid chlorine used to eliminate or prevent the growth of bacteria within the distribution system. Annual flushing occurs each year.

Cowichan Bay Waterworks District water is high quality and falls within the Canadian Drinking Water Standard Guidelines. Water testing is undertaken on a regular basis by the Vancouver Island Health Authority, with the Public Health Officer from Island Health notifying CBWD should there be any issues.

While the availability of water at the Valleyview Wells is substantial, the draw down is limited to our pumping capacity. During the warmer days of summer, the pumps run around the clock. The District participates in a region wide sprinkling regulation program.

21. Backflow or Back Siphonage

Action: Call 250 710 8207

- Locate and remove backflow source.
- Contact VIHA (office: 250-737-2010 or cell 250-715-7000) and
- District Administrator (office: 250-748-1687) or cell 250-709-2470
- Notify all users to boil water for two minutes or take other disinfection procedures in accordance with recommendation of local health officials.
- Notify all users: road signage, radio, website, local media, hand deliver notice & phone Public Business Consumers.
- Erect proper signage and update the alerts system on CBWD website.
- Purge and disinfect lines as directed, after corrections have been made.

22. Well Pump / Booster Pump Failure

Action: Call 250 710 8207

Initiate repairs, monitor situation and proceed accordingly.

23. Broken Water Main

- Call 250 710 8207
- Reduce pressure (but maintain enough pressure to prevent backflow).
- Shut down pumps.
- Place signs showing "Work in Progress" and "Possible Outage Time".
- Advise local Health Unit if requested by Operations.

24. Fire

- Call 911 and request fire services.
- Coordinate response with Fire Department.

25. Fire Hydrant Break

- Call 250 710 8207
- Advise Fire Chief

26. Chlorination System Failure

- Call 250 710 8207
- Notify all users to boil water for two minutes or take other disinfection procedures in accordance with recommendation of local health officials.
- Notify all users: road signage, radio, website, local media, hand deliver notice & phone Public Business Consumers.

27. Contamination of Source - Spills, Vehicle Accidents, Sewage Line Break

- Call 250 710 8207
- Shut down pump if requested.
- Notify Health Unit
- Call District Administrator; Cheryl Wirsz at 250-748-1687or cell 250-710 8507
- Notify all users: road signage, radio, website, local media, hand deliver notice & phone Public Business Consumers.
- Contact local media for public service announcement.
- Arrange alternate source if necessary—i.e., bottled water, bulk hauler, storage tank.

28. Earthquake

In the event of a major earthquake capable of causing damage to the waterworks:

- Call 250 710 8207
- Check reservoirs.
- Check well sites
- Check pump houses.
- Check pressure reducing valves
- Check entire system for leaks.

29. Flood Conditions

- Call District Administrator at 250-710 8705 and/or Chief Water Operator 250 710 8207
- Notify all users regarding the potential for water contamination.
- Users should be advised to store some drinking water and to boil water for two minutes.
- Notify all users: road signage, radio, website, local media, hand deliver notice & phone Public Business Consumers.
- Contact local media for public service announcement.
- Check reservoirs.
- Check well sites
- Check pump houses.
- Check pressure reducing valves

30. Power Failure

- Call BC Hydro. 1-888-769-3766
- Determine how long before service is restored.
- If prolonged, check water tank located at 1760 Pavenham Road.
- Put up signs requesting customers conserve water.
- Subscribers will be notified on an annual basis that they should conserve water whenever the electric
 power is interrupted to their home. Not only is the CBWD's ability to pump water affected, but also the
 individual homes may have septic systems that require electricity to pump water out of the home.

31. DROUGHT REPSONSE PLAN AND LOSS OF SOURCE / LOW WATER LEVELS

- Consult with the Public Health Inspector.
- Be prepared to issue water warnings or boil water advisory.

34. Sample Notification:

Re: Boil Water Advisory for Bacterial Contamination

The Environmental Officer has advised the Cowichan Bay Waterworks District that unacceptable levels of coliform bacterial have been detected in the drinking water system of the Cowichan Bay Waterworks District boundaries. Residents are advised to boil their drinking water for two minutes prior to consumption or prior to washing vegetables, brushing their teeth or using it in the preparation of foods that won't be cooked such as salads, ice cubes or juices. Bottled water may able be used as an alternative to tap water. Tap water is still acceptable for other household uses such as laundry or showering, but care should be taken not to swallow water when showering or bathing.
